~440 foot climb for the whole loop)

# **Driving Directions:**

Northbound on HWY 101, about 3 miles past the town of Orick, turn left onto Davison Rd.,\* go roughly ½ mile to the turn-off for the Elk Meadow Day Use Area on your left and follow the access road to the parking area.

**Southbound on HWY 101,** about 18 miles past the town of Klamath turn right onto Davison Rd.\* (see Davison Rd. directions above).

\*Caution: Davison Rd. is subject to seasonal flooding.



### HOW TO QUEST:

You are holding a treasure map! Follow the movement clues (*italicized*) between stops (numbered) and discover the natural and cultural treasures within this forest. At your final stop you will find your Quest Clue, this is the "key" to your prize (see below for your next step)! Have fun, be safe, and stay on marked trails on this adventure.


#### **NOW THAT YOU'VE FINISHED YOUR QUEST:**



Keep moving forward There's a sign up ahead Make sure to stop there Then raise your head.


